Head-to-toe skin check

- A Primary Care Molemap Check Melanographer will conduct a thorough examination of your skin using a dermoscope – a handheld device which enables visibility of the intricate structure of skin lesions.
- The skin check will determine if there are lesions that show features of skin cancer.
- Any such lesions will be imaged using a dermoscopic camera and sent for subsequent dermatologist diagnosis.
- Where it is established that there are no concerning lesions, the melanographer will discuss this positive outcome with you.

Skin cancer education

You will receive information about checking your skin at home and sun health tips to protect yourself and your family.

Expert dermatologist diagnosis of suspicious moles

- After the appointment if any lesions are selected for imaging, one of our dermatologists will prepare a report which includes images of the specific lesions (including the bodyshot for location purposes) and recommendations for the treatment or monitoring of these.
- Our expert dermatologists have collectively diagnosed over 120,000 patients.

Limitations of Molemap Check

Molemap dermatologists diagnose through dermoscopic analysis of lesions visible on the skin surface. As with any diagnostic service, there are limitations to what can be diagnosed by the Molemap Check system:

- Some types of lesions are not suitable for imaging. You will be advised of any limitations during your appointment.
- This is not a general dermatology consultation and as such we are not able to advise on skin conditions that may not be associated with potential skin cancers.
